#### Dipping Our Toes in the Reddit Sea by Terry Findlay




I am self-professed dinosaur when it comes to social media. I have a Facebook account and belong to a few Facebook groups. I suspect I am not alone within my age group. When the RNA leadership began talking about raising awareness of the religious naturalist orientation it was obvious that we would be looking into ways of leveraging the connectivity of the various social media platforms. I expressed my position quite clearly. I was in full support of exploring and using any and all forms of social media but I had zero interest in being the one to do it.

Fortunately, there were braver souls willing to dive in and take a stab at mounting an RNA social media campaign. Since most were familiar with Facebook that would be where we would start. Valiant efforts were made and there were some successes but after awhile things just kind of petered out.

However, all was not in vain. Partly as a result of the Facebook groups' efforts a number of new members came onboard and within these members were a few younger people who, on their applications, stated interests in internet related activities. I am delighted to say that we now have a manager for our RNA Forum (Rachel Krishnaswami), a manager of Search Engine Optimization (Angie Wilson), and a manager of Traffic and Social Media (Jack Green).

Ili pika (*Ochontana iliensis*) is a small mammal (only 7-8 inches long) that's native to the Tianshan mountain range of the <u>remote Xinjiang region of China</u>. Living on sloping bare rock faces and feeding on grasses at high elevations, this little creature is very rare — there are less than 1,000 left. The species was only discovered in 1983, but its <u>numbers have declined by almost 70% since then</u>.

#### Book of the Month The Invention of Nature by Andrea Wulf

In this illuminating biography, Andrea Wulf brings Humboldt's extraordinary life back into focus: his prediction of human-induced climate change; his daring expeditions to the highest peaks of South America and to the anthrax-infected steppes of Siberia; his relationships with iconic figures, including Simón Bolívar and Thomas Jefferson; and the lasting influence of his writings on Darwin, Wordsworth, Goethe, Muir, Thoreau, and many others. Brilliantly researched and stunningly written, *The Invention of Nature* reveals the myriad ways in which Humboldt's ideas form the foundation of modern environmentalism—and reminds us why they are as prescient and vital as ever.
