### Mother Nature's Prayer by Ursula Goodenough

Our Mother, who art within us, Hallowed be thy name. Thy ways evolve, Thy will calls forth This earth that is now our heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, And fill us with tenderness As we repair our trespasses. And lead us forth into fulfillment, And deliver us into harmony. For thine is our wellspring And our grounding and our glory Forever and ever, amen.

Probably all RNA members, regardless of religious or nonreligious heritages, are at least familiar with the Lord's Prayer given its ubiquity at numerous services and commemorations.

I've recently tried my hand at writing an alternative version, shown above, where several RNA members suggested excellent edits after I posted it several months ago.

The original Lord's Prayer is attributed to Jesus in both Luke and Matthew. He would have voiced it in <u>Aramaic</u>; a Latin version is <u>here</u>. I crafted my version to retain the familiar and beautiful structure and cadence of the King James' version, allowing it to be sung using existing <u>hymnity</u> But I address the words not to a Lord in Heaven but to the wondrous forces and glory of Nature – our wellspring and our grounding -- personified as Mother Nature.

The prayer personifies. It names a Mother Nature to whom we can pray, a Mother who gives and fills and repairs and leads and delivers, a Mother who has a story. This is, of course, a metaphor, the bedrock of our language and hence our ability to make meaning. Writer James Geary: "A metaphor is both detour and destination, a digression that gets to the point." A similar metaphor speaks of Gaia rather than of <u>Mother Nature</u>, and personalized concepts of nature are embedded in many Asian, Indigenous, and Pagan traditions.

The Mother Nature's prayer for sure works better for me than the original (and please feel free to share it with others and to tailor it to your sensibilities). That said, I am actually less drawn to prayers that personify the natural world, and more drawn to prayers that celebrate the natural world. I resonate with Ralph Waldo Emerson who wrote in 1871, "Prayer is the contemplation of the facts of life from the highest point of view. It is the soliloquy of a beholding and jubilant soul."

Beholding means grateful. Jubilant derives from "make a joyful noise." And "contemplation of the facts of life from the highest point of view" connotes deep interest in and reverence for our earthly understandings and the humility that accompanies such reverence. So for Emerson, to pray is to voice reverent jubilant gratitude.

We religious naturalists take Nature to mind – the facts of life -- and to heart, experiencing jubilation and gratitude and reverence and humility for the gift of the natural world of which we are a part.

So do religious naturalists have prayers that say these things? Most assuredly. The best of these, I would say, come to us from our "nature poets". Here are seven of my favorites, with more in <u>my book</u> and on our compilation of <u>RN Voices</u>.


