Can Religious Naturalists proselytize? Should we? by JD Stillwater

RNA is now a global community of 1250 members from every U.S. state and 52 countries, with about five new members each week, and more than 20 volunteer workers keeping it all going. Many new members say something like, "I've thought this way for a while but didn't know there was a name for it!" They find us through friends, teachers, colleagues, book clubs, YouTube, and churches, but it's slow.

Proselytize: the attempt to convert someone from one belief to another.

I don't think we have to proselytize; our fellow RNs are already out there looking for us. If RN is an orientation whose time has come (says me), how can we be more conspicuous? One idea: go to liberal religious spaces and be conspicuous. For me, this meant curating the Science Tent at the Wild Goose Festival, and speaking at Chautauqua Institution this summer. Wild Goose Festival is a camp meeting/conference/music festival for liberal Christians in NC; Chautauqua is the historic interfaith institution in upstate NY.

I found SO MANY people who resonate with science as a source of religious sensibility! Some are RNs who didn't know it, some are "RN-adjacent," and some hold more traditional religious beliefs, but I didn't meet anyone who wasn't enthusiastic about science/

nature as a source of inspiration and religiosity. I was encouraged; it is safe and effective for us to be conspicuous.



The Chautauqua talk turned into an *ad hoc* RNA gathering (see item and photos). Speaking of being more conspicuous, RNA now has FOUR contributing writers, endowing our website with color, freshness, and brilliance. Watch for them at the website and on social media! They are: Elle Harrigan, Laura Emerson, J.X. Mason, and Cari Taylor. Huge gratitude to them for sharing their work. An experiment: I've been leaving business-card-sized invitations in random places. So far, only one new member has come from this, partly because I'm so sporadic in my card-leaving. Stay tuned; the experiment continues.



Natural Wonder of the Month Immortal Jellyfish



The immortal jellyfish is a species of jellyfish that is biologically immortal. A mature jellyfish can revert to its immature form—called a polyp—through a process called transdifferentiation. It's a rare process in which the mature, specialized cells that make up the jellyfish can revert to an entirely different structure. Aging, physical damage from predators, and adverse environmental conditions can all serve as catalysts to start the process. In the wild, though, this tiny jellyfish (mature individuals are about the size of a human fingernail) still usually succumbs to predators or disease.
