Younger By The Day by Terry Findlay

I was recently reminded of the extraordinary resillience of living things and, in particular, of my own body.

I had been experiencing increasing weakness and reduced stamina. I attributed the symptoms to, as my son, an ER doctor, puts it, "too many birthdays". I am 80 and I assumed my body was slowly running down. But when I began falling down on a regular basis my son decided it was time to take me to the hospital where a CT scan revealed the real problem.

I underwent surgery for a bilateral subdural hematoma. Blood had accumulated between my brain and dura, the lining of the skull, and was exerting pressure on my brain. The pressure was causing the loss of strength and stamina.

The treatment involved drilling holes in either side of my skull and inserting tubes to drain the accumulated blood and relieve the problematic pressure on my brain. Fortunately, the surgery went well and I was able to go home after only a day of recovery in the hospital.

It has taken a few weeks to fully recover and during that time I have witnessed the miraculous powers of regeneration built into my body. Gradually, my stamina and strength have been restored. My bodily systems identified the work that needed to be done and set about making the necessary repairs. The restoration of my body gave me the strange but wonderful impression that I was growing younger by the day.

That the intricacies of the chemical processes involved have been assembled by evolution over millions of years is astonishing in its own right. That I am a conscious of being capable of experiencing and marveling at it all is even more astounding.

For me, the ability of organisms to self-repair demonstrates the capacity of natural selection to arrive at ways of enhancing the chances of survival of living things. By relentless trial and error, over enormous spans of time, nature works its many wonders. I am in awe of being a part of it.

Summer Solstice 2025 And The First Day Of Summer



The first day of summer arrives with the solstice this year on Friday, June 20, 2025, 10:42 p.m. EDT. For those of us in the Northern Hemisphere, the Earth tilts mostly toward the Sun during this time. As seen from Earth, the Sun will be directly overhead at noon 23.5 degrees north of the equator, at an imaginary line encircling the globe known as the Tropic of Cancer, named for the constellation Cancer the Crab, its northernmost point.

The term "solstice" comes from the Latin words sol (Sun) and sistere (to stand still). At the solstice, the angle between the Sun's rays and the plane of the Earth's equator (called declination) appears to stand still. This phenomenon is most noticeable at the Arctic Circle where the Sun hugs the horizon for a continuous 24 hours, thus the term "Land of the Midnight Sun."

The summer solstice has long been celebrated by cultures around the world:

- In Ancient Egypt, the summer solstice coincided with the rising of the Nile River. As it was crucial to predict this annual flooding, the Egyptian New Year began at this important solstice.
- In centuries past, the Irish would cut hazel branches on solstice eve to be used in searching for gold, water, and precious jewels.
- Many European cultures hold what are known as Midsummer celebrations at the solstice, which include gatherings at Stonehenge and the lighting of bonfires on hilltops.

Evolution's Gift of Play






